



DOC TALK

Welcome to Melanoma Land!

You won't find this caption displayed anytime soon on Florida tourism posters but summer is here and so are more of the damaging ultraviolet rays that promote skin cancer. Although sun-worshippers might beg to differ, there is no question that the Florida sunshine should be consumed in moderation.

Why the concern about sun exposure? In one word – melanoma. Of all types of skin cancer, melanoma is the most feared. If the diagnosis is delayed, melanoma has the potential to spread to distant sites and can be deadly. More than 44,000 people are diagnosed with melanoma every year in the United States and the rates have more than doubled over the last 20 years.

Melanoma is largely preventable because most cases are related to excessive sunlight exposure. People with fair skin and freckles are at higher risk, but melanoma can occur in anyone. The basic principles of prevention include limitation of sun exposure during peak UV hours (10am to 4pm), regular use of

sunblock with sun protection factor (SPF) of 15 to 30, and use of sunglasses and wide-brimmed hats.

Despite our best intentions, melanoma is not always preventable. Studies have shown that risk of melanoma may actually be most closely related to sun exposure and sunburns that occur during childhood. We can't go back and reverse our childhood and adolescent sun exposure, but can practice active surveillance of suspicious skin lesions as adults.

The hallmarks of melanoma are a dark spot on the skin that has irregular borders, variable color, size more than 6mm, and is asymmetric. Rapid growth in size is also worrisome. Since it may be difficult for even an experienced doctor to identify melanoma correctly it may be best for those at higher risk to see a dermatologist for regular skin examinations. Some people are at much higher risk of melanoma because of family history and may benefit from regular skin examinations and total body skin photography.

One must keep the risks of excessive sun exposure in perspective. After all, many of us chose to live in Florida precisely because we enjoy sunshine, water sports and activities. The key is moderation and sensible precautions, then go ahead and catch those rays.


Dr. Pierone is married with two children. He was born and raised in New Jersey, attended medical school at The University of Florida in Gainesville, and did his Internal Medicine residency at the University of Medicine and Dentistry in New Brunswick, New Jersey. He completed his Infectious Disease fellowship at Mount Sinai Medical Center in New York.

Dr. Pierone has been in private practice in Vero Beach, Florida since 1990. He specializes in the treatment of HIV and

hepatitis C, and is actively involved in research. He is also the founder and medical director of the AIDS Research and Treatment Center of the Treasure Coast, a not-for-profit HIV clinic located in Ft. Pierce, Florida.

They seem to specialize in large, metal, pre-assembled automobile models, which are scattered throughout the

store – featuring cars from the 40's through even the most current models. I also noticed an impressive



display of smaller Matchbox and Hot Wheels cars. I am proud to say that I still have all my toy cars from when I was a kid, and I was surprised to know that they really have gone up so much in value.
