

Low Back Pain

Most back pain occurs in the lower back area called the lumbosacral region of the spine. Low back pain is very common among adults and is often caused by overuse and muscle strain or injury. Other less common causes of low back pain include illness and spinal deformity.

Back pain is often referred to as acute or chronic; however, there are different opinions about how these terms are defined. In general, acute low back pain lasts a short time (less than 3 months), and chronic low back pain lasts a long time (more than 3 months) and often returns. Fortunately, most cases of low back pain are considered acute, and the pain goes away within 4 to 6 weeks.

Treatment for low back pain is usually effective. It includes staying active and continuing normal activities; avoiding activities that may increase or cause back pain;

Treatment is less effective for chronic low back pain. Chronic low back pain is harder to treat because it may involve limitation of normal activities, decreased quality of life, the potential for increasingly strong pain medications and alcohol abuse, and symptoms of

Surgery is not indicated for most causes of low back surgery.

The most common causes of low back pain are:

Injury caused by strain to muscles, ligaments, facet joints, or the sacroiliac joint. This can be the result of an injury or overuse.

Pressure on nerve roots in the spinal canal. Nerve root compression may be caused by:

- A herniated disc.
- Osteoarthritis, (facet joint degeneration, spondylolysis).

Fractures of the vertebrae caused by injuries (from auto accidents, falls from significant heights, direct blows to the spine, or blows that transmit significant force to the spine such as being struck on top of the head or falling onto the buttocks). In a person who has osteoporosis, even a small amount of force put on the spine, such as from a sneeze, may cause a compression fracture.

Other medical conditions may cause low back pain,

Pelvic Inflamatory disease

taking nonprescription pain relievers, such as nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs); and doing stretching and strengthening exercises for the

pain. Certain conditions that cause low back pain, such as a herniated disc, may benefit from surgery. However, even in these cases, most people will improve without

- Spinal stenosis.
- Spinal deformities, including curvature problems such as scoliosis and kyphosis (unless severe, these rarely cause symptoms).
- Deformities or defects in parts of the vertebrae that cause one vertebra to slip forward on top of the one below it, resulting in misalignment of the bones of the spine (spondylolisthesis).
- Compression fracture.

such as:

- Aortic aneurism.
- Peptic ulcer disease
- Gallbladder disease.


Most low back pain is the result of some combination of overuse and muscle strain or injury to the muscles and ligaments that support the spine. Some experts believe that over time, chronic strain can lead to an overall "imbalance" in the structure of the spine. The result is a constant tension on the muscles, ligaments, bones, and discs that may make the back more susceptible to injury.

The causes of low back pain may be interrelated. For example, when muscles or ligaments are strained, the likelihood of injury to the discs is increased.

Quick, what's a GSA? Ok, stop guessing, it's a Gay Straight Alliance, you know, a high school club, like the chess club, or bible club, or cheerleaders club. Except it isn't. Seems there's quite a problem finding faculty sponsors and keeping the club going after its started – if it gets started. Currently Brevard high schools try to include a GSA as part of a Diversity Club so they can avoid that nasty G word. And we know how open the racial minorities are to our discrimination issues - Coretta Scott King, notably, aside. It just isn't going to work.

In theory it sounds good. But when you think about putting GLBT white kids who want to talk about being called a fag and lez and being spit upon in a mostly minority group more interested in dealing with how the white majority has oppressed them... Well, it's going to be as effective as expecting the GLBT minority students to out themselves in a group of Blacks and Hispanics that are even less accepting than the white community. What a mess! And as everyone keeps telling me: "This area is just so conservative this won't work."

Fortunately at least one youth in the area believes in his ability to change things. Drake Austin, pictured on the cover, is going to start a GSA at Astronaut High School in Titusville. A junior, he has a group of approximately 15 that wants to have their own club to deal with their own issues, just like other groups have their own club to deal with their issues.

He doesn't want a closeted group trying to deal with coming out issues, a hidden group trying to deal with public oppression, he wants an out group dealing with being out issues. Luckily, he has remarkable parents who support him 100%. It was heart-warming to see parents concerned, understanding and determined to help their gay child. Not something I remember.

Unfortunately Astronaut HS has not proved very supportive. The first-year teacher that was going to sponsor the GSA withdrew after the issue was discussed at a staff meeting. I was unable to reach Astronaut HS principal, Dr. Krupp, for comment by deadline.

I did speak to the principal at Cocoa Beach HS, and learned that their GSA was melded into their Diversity club this year. According to Austin, the Diversity club at Satellite HS is no longer active. Austin said the Satellite Beach HS group was supposed to be a GSA, but the founder acceded to the school's wishes, and made it a Diversity club. That explains the Satellite HS listing on the GLSEN web site (which lists GSAs).

Austin's own experience at Astronaut is something which far too many of us can relate: high school memories of the hurt of the epithet "faggot!" uttered at them or others. More than a few of us have experienced the personal violation of vandalism. Austin's experience was not a defaced locker or personal property, it was his school band instrument. Austin is the only string bass player at Astronaut HS. Recently it was discovered that someone urinated in it.

Now we're talking major trouble, as the expense the school will have to incur to restore the instrument means the police are involved. Remembering high school, I predict that the culprit will be found. How the adults handle the situation is the real question. We all know whom the perpetrator's friends and high school clique will blame for their friends' problem. What do you bet the kid who did it was egged on by others, a test of "manhood," a dare? What will be their reaction?

Will this homophobia be addressed to the student body as a whole to head off retribution? I doubt it. Will this stop Austin? No. Will this help educate people about what it's like to be GLBT? Yes.

Whatever the outcome, Austin has succeeded because more people have had to deal with a GLBT issue. Some will change their opinion; others will learn to deal with true diversity; some will never change. But there will be a net gain in understanding, an opening for the future. Some change has been accomplished already.

Drake Austin's parents have filed an appeal to Dr. Krupp's rejection of the formation of a GSA at Astronaut HS. They have also filed with the ACLU so the school knows they are serious. Hopefully this thing can be worked out without much expense to our already decimated school budgets. A determined individual can effect great change if he stays the course and a bunch of addle headed adults can make a few law firms very rich.

In my humble opinion, the perpetrator's parents should pay for the damages; the perpetrator and his buddies should have to do, say 100 hours at Project Response or an AIDS hospice. The GSA should be formed forthwith and the fact announced to the whole school to prove that the school isn't going to put up with such antics. I anticipate over-reaction

by everyone and the potential for very large legal fees and much media posturing by Christian Fundamentalists.

As one, we can be a challenged people, but as many we can celebrate our diversity as a people, called to a better way of life, to a more active presence to those who need us.


