Spiritually Speaking

Who is our neighbor?

According to Luke 10:25-37, Jesus was asked a question by a person specializing as a religion scholar. This is someone who studied scripture and applied the "laws" of God to those he met. In some translations, this person is referred to as a lawyer! Anyway, the question asked of Jesus was what that person had to DO to gain eternal life. Jesus turned it back around on him and asked what God's law had to say about that issue. The answer, love the Lord your God with all your heart and your neighbor as yourself (King James Version).

Jesus replied that he was correct but then the man asked who his neighbor was...Jesus used the parable of the Good Samaritan to illustrate who our neighbor is.

The story of the Good Samaritan is probably familiar to all of us but I will recap scripture so we are all on the same page. This man was traveling and was attacked by robbers who left him naked, beaten, and on the side of the road. A priest and a Levite religious man passed by without helping him. Finally, a Samaritan stopped and rendered aid by attending to his medical needs, giving him a ride to an inn, and paying his lodging and food until he was well.

After telling the parable, Jesus asked who became the neighbor of the injured man and the man answered, "The one who treated him kindly!"

Who are our neighbors? Who do we treat kindly? Do we treat all we meet with kindness and compassion or just those who we think are "worthy" of our time and energy?

I once had a friend named Karen in Houston, Texas. She played the piano beautifully and often played for me as I sang in our church. She and her husband Ron decided to begin exchanging letters with an inmate and the "Walls" in Huntsville, Texas. This is the prison where those sentenced to death are housed and executed but it also holds those with lesser sentences who have medical problems. Well, the young man they befriended was named David and he was in for repeatedly stealing cars and robbing people. He had served 8 of his 10 years when Karen and Ron began writing, visiting, and giving money to him. They continued until he was to be paroled but he could not be released until he had an address so they took this young man into their home. We of the church pitched in and got him a wardrobe and a job. He was doing great and was, by his own admission, happier than he had ever been in his life. He had a place to live, a job, friends, a loving church, and was beginning to think he had it made! He was our neighbor and we were glad to help him and see him doing so well.

Fast forward about 8 months. Early one Sunday morning I was at the church waiting for Karen to arrive so we could practice my music when the pastor found me and said Karen needed a ride. I called her and was told that their car had been stolen in the night, and that David was gone along with all of their money! I asked if they had called the police and was told they had not as they felt that David would return and make things right. Guess what, he didn't! He spent the money on drugs and alcohol and
